Lacking Veterinary Care for North Country Pets

Every day our office receives calls from clients in need of affordable spay/neuter services. Many of them are looking for help with a family pet, but others are looking to get the local stray or feral cat fixed. The unfortunate truth is that in both cases, many of the animals coming to our mobile clinic are lacking even the basics of veterinary care.

Over the past 7 years and 6,741 spays & neuters, 91% of cats and 42% of dogs required vaccinations against rabies. 96% of cats and 63% of dogs were not protected against feline and canine distemper. 90% of animals had no flea protection and other pets had existing, untreated and sometimes severe disease conditions significant enough that we could not perform a safe surgery.

SNN's mobile clinic is not a full service clinic and there are many conditions that we cannot cure with our spay/neuter supplies. We include vaccinations for rabies, distemper and a flea treatment as part of our spay/neuter package.

Beat the Heat by Spaying & Neutering Your Pets!



As summer 2015 comes to a close, our spay/neuter programs have been hard at work resulting in **896 cats & dogs** getting fixed and no longer contributing to overpopulation in the North Country this year!

We thank Town & Country Vet Clinic, with which we are celebrating the first anniversary of our partner spay/neuter program that since August 2014 has fixed over 420 pets!

Unfortunately, puppy and kitten season does not wait for our four-legged friends with pets that will be going back into heat this fall. Far too many of the stray and feral cats have already had one or two litters this year and SNN needs your help to support caretakers of unowned, barn and colony cats, as well as low-income and military households to keep the pet population under control in the area.

We touched bases with the farm that SNN helped trap, spay/neuter and release 41 barn cats (they thought they had 26!) in October 2013 and they have not had a litter since! This is a perfect example of how spaying & neutering makes a significant difference in keeping the population under control and it is thanks to your support!

North Country Low Cost Vaccine Program

SNN is collaborating with Jefferson County Public Health Service to increase vaccination rates within the county. Public Health has been providing rabies vaccine and supplies for SNN to distribute as part of our mobile clinic program for the underserved populations that may not traditionally be able to seek veterinary services.

It is mandatory by law to maintain rabies vaccinations for your pets. Funds for this NY Ag & Markets program were secured by Senator Patty Ritchie and resources are distributed locally by Public Health.

Public Health hopes that assisting SNN will also support responsible population control by fixing pets.
